The practice of day-to-day policing in Canada allows for the use of Stingray surveillance technology. Stingray is the generic name for an electronic surveillance tool that simulates a cell phone tower in order to force mobile phones and other devices to connect to it instead of to a legitimate cell tower. Other common names for the tool are “cell-site simulator” and “IMSI catcher. Cell site simulators are pieces of hardware that mimic the telecommunications towers used by phones to relay messages and to send and receive calls.
